

Slippery Rock Municipal Authority held its regular monthly meeting on Wednesday, May 13, 2026, at the Slippery Rock Municipal Authority Office, 116 Crestview Road, Slippery Rock, PA.

Present at the Authority Office were Paul Dickey, Craig Caldwell, J.P. Howard, Matt Kovacik, Tom McPherson, Josh Miller, Heather Sholes, Lauren Montgomery, James Campbell, and Todd Campbell.

Chairman, Dickey, called the Regular Monthly Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

McPherson moved to approve the minutes of the regular meeting held on April 8, 2026. Kovacik seconded, and the motion passed.

Kovacik moved to approve the payment of bills for April 2026:

McPherson seconded, and the motion passed.

McPherson moved to approve the April bank statements and reconciliations. Kovacik seconded the motion passed.

Dickey recognized James and Todd Campbell as persons to be heard from 6:03 p.m. to 6:21 p.m. to discuss the Applewood Liftstation incident on March 13, 2026, causing sewer backup in the basement of James Campbell's residence. Campbell expressed that he is seeking financial relief after receiving a denial from the Authority's insurance provider. Following the conversation with the Campbell's, the board requested that the Authority go back to their insurance provider to revisit their decision.

Sholes, Executive Administrator, reported:

Sholes reported that the 2025 Financial Audit will be conducted May 26<sup>th</sup> and May 27<sup>th</sup>.

Miller, General Manager, reported:

**Business/Operations**

- 565 Slippery Rock Road
  - Applewood Lift Station Power Failure
  - Kelly Generator Motherboard Repair
  - Still waiting on quote for motherboard
  - Looking to switch from Kelly Generator
    - Met with Cleveland Brothers (CAT) 05/13
- Arrowhead Liftstation
  - Fiberglass Reinforced Plastic (FRP) and Concrete Masonry Unit (CMU) Specs and Comparison
  - EADs will send out bid packet
  - FRP was more favorable after reviewing specs
- 358 East Water Street
  - Sewer Lateral Blockage
  - Water Street was lined in 2012
    - This address never had the lateral cut out
  - Water trickled out from a crack in the liner
    - Restricted
    - Lateral is now fully cut out
  - Customer responsibility to the sewer tap
  - SRMA repaired the lateral in the street at the tap
- Elm Street Water Line Replacement
  - Consulted with Slippery Rock Borough
    - Would like to pave the 2<sup>nd</sup> portion of Elm Street in 2027
  - For 2026, SRMA would like to replace the waterline from the Firehall to Cooper Street
  - Bid for limestone
  - Bid for asphalt
  - Tentative to start project in July

Following Miller's report on the Elm Street Waterline Replacement, Kovacik moved to advertise for limestone and asphalt for bid for the Elm Street Waterline Trench. Howard seconded, and the motion passed.

Miller continued to report:

**Water Treatment Plants**

- Forrester Road NPDES Permit Renewal
  - Update to Permit
    - Updates and corrections from the previous engineers
  - Submission
    - Due June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2026
  - Match the backwash lines at Hines Water Treatment Plan
- 2025 Annual Consumer Confidence Report (CCR)
  - 2025 CCR has been posted to the website, and a line has been added to the May bills for customers

Following Miller's report, Dickey reported that he was in correspondence with Allegheny Mineral Corporation inquiring about a donation of land for the Authority's new maintenance garage.

With no further business, at 7:09 p.m., Caldwell moved to adjourn, Howard seconded, and the motion carried.
